

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Avalon Village working in consultation with Queensland Health authorities prioritises the health and safety of all our residents and staff.

STANDARD ENTRY CONDITIONS APPLICABLE AT ALL TIMES DURING PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCIES

You must **not** enter or **remain** on this premises if:

1. During the past 14 days, you were an **international arrival** from a place outside **Australia**; or
2. During the past 14 days, you have been in a place or travelled through a declared **COVID-19 hotspot**; or
3. During the past 14 days, you have been to an **interstate exposure venue**, or
4. During the past 14 days you have been in a place which is an **interstate area of concern (vulnerable facilities)**; or
5. You have been informed you are a **close contact** of a **diagnosed person**, and your quarantine has not ended; or
6. You have a temperature equal to or higher than 37.5 degrees or exhibiting any respiratory symptoms (including but not limited to a cough or shortness of breath) sore throat, fatigue, loss of smell or taste, a runny nose, muscle pain, joint pain, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting or loss of appetite; or
7. You have been tested for COVID-19 and has not yet received the results of that test; or
8. You are a **student** and have been in a **restricted area** in the preceding 14 days, unless the person is a **vaccinated student**.

ADDITIONAL ENTRY CONDITIONS WHEN RESTRICTED AREAS ARE INVOKED BY THE GOVERNMENT

Is there currently restricted access?

GENERAL VISITORS WHEN IN RESTRICTED AREAS

General and personal visitors are **not** allowed to enter or remain on the premises of the restricted shared disability accommodation service unless the person's presence at the premises is for the purposes of providing health, medical, therapeutic, social work, **essential disability support** or pharmaceutical services to a resident of the restricted shared disability accommodation service, whether the goods or services are provided for consideration or on a voluntary basis

In addition to the above, any person attending a restricted shared disability accommodation service must, to the extent reasonably practicable:

- a. Practise physical distancing; and
- b. Limit their contact with other persons at the facility.

WEARING OF FACE MASKS WHEN IN RESTRICTED AREAS

Any person (other than a resident) must not enter, or remain on, the premises of a restricted shared disability accommodation service without wearing a single use surgical face mask.

Non-compliance with the above conditions from the Queensland Health may be committing an offence. Management reserves the right to refuse entry to any person who does not comply with the conditions of entry.
